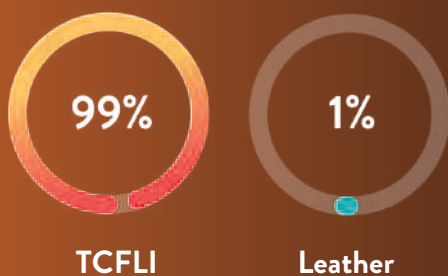
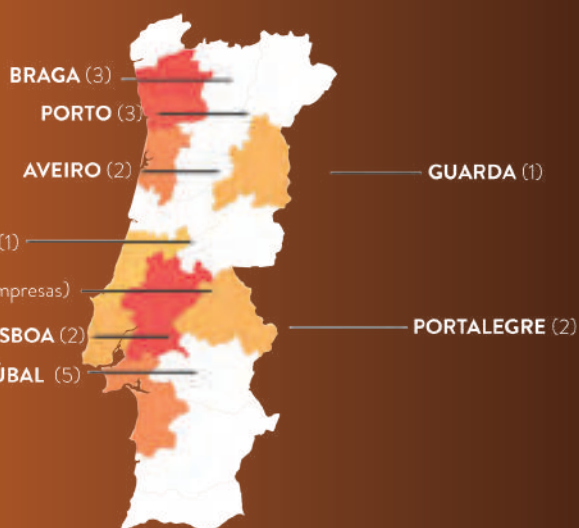
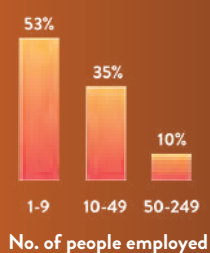


WHO ARE WE in the leather sector in Portugal?

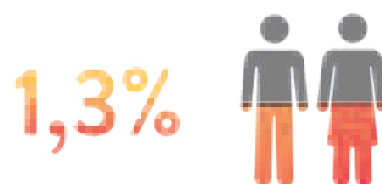


In 2020, the tanning **industry accounted for around 1,1%** of companies in the Textile, Clothing, Footwear and Leather Industry (TCFLI).

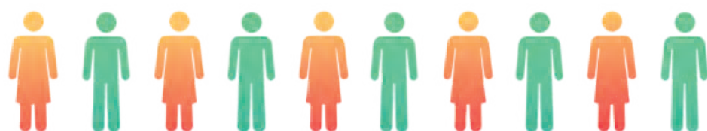
Most of them are **micro and small** businesses.
 Around **87% of companies** have **fewer than 50 employees**.



80% of leather are concentrated in the **district of Santarém**.



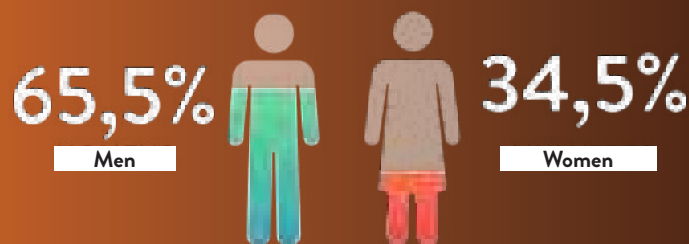
The **tanning industry** employs around 1.3% of **TCFLI workers**.



Between 2012 and 2018, there was a net increase of **209 jobs** in this sector.

But the effects of **COVID-19** have complicated the assessment of this trend between 2020 and 2022.

In 2020, around **65.5% of the 1.978 workers** were **men**.

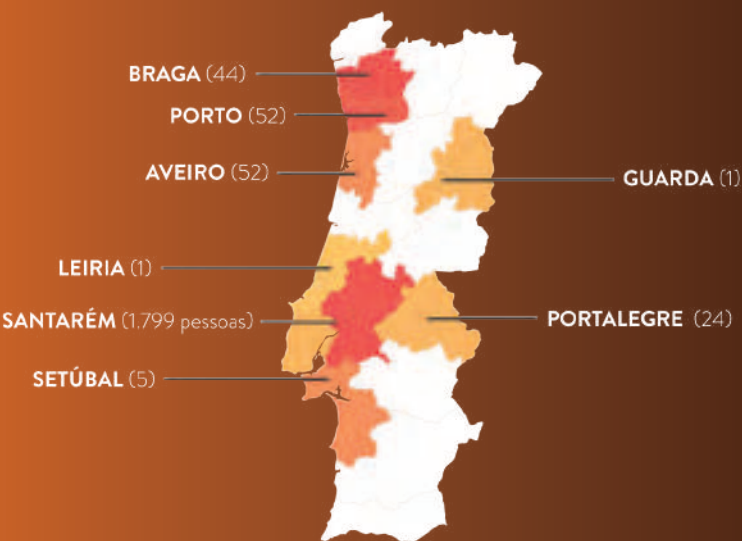

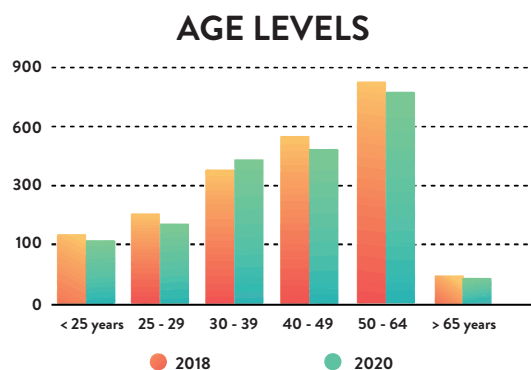

Santarém leads employment in the leather industry with more than **1.799 workers**.

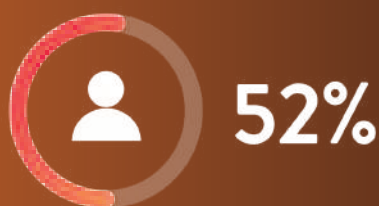
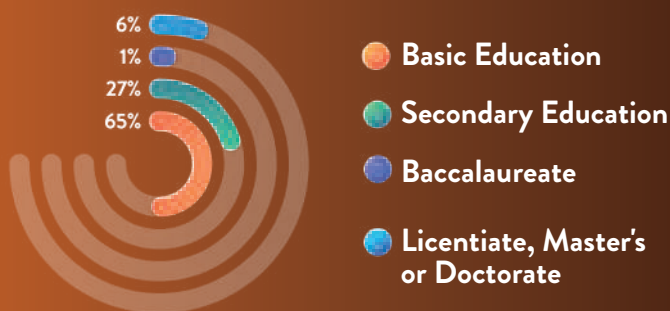


The leather sector has not been able to attract young workers, which is creating greater **difficulty in generational** renewal, especially in the production area.

The only increase in the number of workers was seen in the **30-39 age group**.

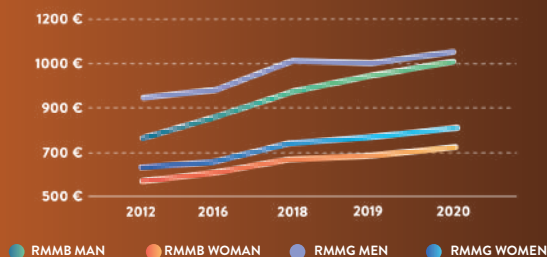
The majority of workers, **64.9%**, only have **basic education**.
